Poseidon Proposal & the OPA

- Mitigation for 421.4 acres
- Preservation: 108 acres Dredging of Bolsa Chica Inlet
- Restoration: 5.7 acres for Subtidal Habitat
- Enhancement 15 acres for water circulation
- Alternatives
- Artificial reef as recommended by CA Coastal Commission
- What about mitigation for Huntington Beach Wetlands, Los Cerritos, Newport Bay?

- The OPA requires: mitigation be accomplished through expansion, restoration or creation Section M.2.e(3)(b)(l)
- Mitigation must be sufficient to address the expected project impacts over the operational lifetime of the facility-Section M.2.e
- Preservation is NOT what is required
- Santa Ana Water Board staff have acknowledged that inlet maintenance dredging would be considered a "preservation" form of mitigation
- Mitigation should only be considered AFTER minimizing mortality with the best site, design and technology - OPA subsection (e)

Bolsa Chica Wetlands

- Since the 1800's LAC & OC have lost more than 90% of their wetlands due to development and urbanization
- SoCal Wetlands Recovery Project Report says: "because of rapidly rising sea levels wetland restoration must occur before 2030 in order to establish mature marshes that are more resilient to sealevel rise.
- Wetlands restoration projects take approximately 20 to 40 years from planning to completion of a fully functioning wetland
- Bolsa Chica Lowlands was reconstructed to its original conditions in the 1800s

- The Bolsa Chica Land Trust with an 8 member Steering Committee commissioned a study on alternatives to dredging to be completed in December 2020
- The Bolsa Chica Land Trust does not support the proposed Poseidon plant
- Bolsa Chica Land Trust does not believe the mitigation offered offsets a 427 acre dead zone
- Would mitigation live with the plant when it is handed over to OCWD?
- Proposed mitigation consists primarily of dredging to maintain areas of Bolsa Chica for which mitigation credits were already approved
